

You can “Take Action” and help pass HR. 4965/S. 2683 the 9/11 Responder & Survivor Health Funding Correction Act

With the impending budget shortfall facing the World Trade Center Health Program starting in 2025, U.S. Senators Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY) and U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles E. Schumer (D-NY), and U.S. Representatives Carolyn B. Maloney (D-NY-12), Jerrold Nadler (D-NY-10), and Andrew Garbarino (R-NY-2) introduced, [“9/11 Responder and Survivor Health Funding Correction Act”](#) (HR.4965/S. 2683). Its purpose is to ensure the adequate funding for the World Trade Center Health Program so it can continue to provide medical treatment and monitoring to injured and ill 9/11 responders and survivors.

The World Trade Center Health Program (WTCHP) currently provides medical treatment and monitoring for over 117,000 9/11 responders and survivors from the World Trade Center and lower Manhattan, the Pentagon, and the Shanksville crash site, who live in [every State](#) and [434 out of 435 Congressional Districts](#).

However, in coming years, the World Trade Center Health Program will not have enough funds to provide all the care that is needed for those still suffering the physical and mental impact of 9/11. Unless something is done to deal with the impending deficit, starting in October of 2024 the program will have to stop taking new members. This means that responders and survivors who will be newly diagnosed with 9/11-associated cancers caused by their toxic exposures in the coming years. You can help make sure that doesn't happen.

Find out if your Member of Congress is a co-sponsor of the 9/11 Responder and Survivor Health Funding Correction Act (H.R. 4965/ S. 2683) and if not contact them and urge them to join in cosponsoring the legislation.
